THE PEOPLE'S CHOICE AWARDS

Vote for your favorite band by placing cash in the appropriate container near the south entrance to the main spectator stands. Vote as often, and for as many bands, as you like. The band with the most cash in their container at the end of each voting period will win!

Scholastic Small & Large, Class D and Class C will be judged together.
Classes B and A will be judged together.

FIELD COMPETITION FORMAT

WARM-UP — Each band is allowed a warm-up period, which begins approximately 40 minutes prior to the scheduled performance time.

ENTERING THE FIELD — Each band is allowed 3 minutes to stage and warm-up on the field.

PERFORMANCE — Each band must perform a show that is no longer than 10 minutes.

EXITING THE FIELD — Each band is allowed 2 minutes to exit the field after the conclusion of the show.

ADJUDICATION — A total of eight judges will be used. Two for **visual performance** (individual and ensemble), two for **music** (individual and ensemble), two for **general effect** (individual and ensemble), one for **color guard** and one for **percussion**. Only visual, music and general effect judges' scores determine the final score for the band. Color guard and percussion are scored for caption awards only, and all judges provide a recorded commentary to assist in interpreting how scores were determined.



SCORING FORMAT

Each band is evaluated on both music and visual performance. Judges use evaluation sheets with a criterion reference to score each band in various categories—from both the press box and in the field. These scores are added together to determine a band's overall score. **Each category has a maximum score of 20 points.** The highest possible overall score is 100 points.



STAFF BIOGRAPHIES

Luke Aylsworth - Director of Bands



Luke Aylsworth is a third generation band director. For over seventy years, there was an Aylsworth as the Director of Bands at Springs Valley Jr./Sr. High School in French Lick, IN. Luke's father John and grandfather Gilbert also held the same position. In 2021, after twenty years at Springs Valley, Mr. Aylsworth accepted the Director of Bands position at Greenwood Community High School.

Luke's bands have placed in the top five at the Indiana State School Music Association State Marching Band Finals every year since 2006 including three ISSMA Class D State Championships (2010, 2016, and 2017) and six State Championship Runner-Up finishes (2007, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2018). In 2009, the Springs Valley Blackhawk Brigade was a Bands of America Grand Nationals Semi-Finalist and placed 3rd in Class A. The Springs Valley Winter Winds ensemble also won the 2021 Indiana Percussion Association State Championship in Winds Scholastic A class.

In winter percussion, Luke's ensembles were a state finalist every year they competed in the Indiana Percussion Association and TriState circuits. The ensemble earned top-five finishes including two Bronze Medals and two Silver Medal finishes. In 2014, the ensemble was the IPA PSCA State Champion Runner-Up. In 2015, the ensemble was the TriState PSCA Champion.

In 2012, 2014, 2015, 2017, and 2018 the Springs Valley Band Department was designated as one of the best communities for music education in the United States by the NAMM Foundation. His program also received the NAMM Support-Music Merit Award in 2014, 2015, 2017, and 2018. In addition, Springs Valley was a Grammy Foundation Signature School Semi-Finalist in 2013. The band was recognized for artistry, hard work, and musical excellence by Indiana Governor Mitch Daniels and U.S. Vice President Mike Pence (former Indiana Governor). In 2014, Luke was awarded the Peabody Energy Leaders in Education Award. In 2018, Luke was inducted to the Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Fraternity.

Luke has a Master's of Science in Music Technology and a Bachelor's of Music Education degree from Indiana University. While at IU, Luke studied with Gerald Carlyss, Wilbur England, James Strain and Jim Ancona.

Luke is an international percussion arranger/composer, show designer, adjudicator and consultant. He has arrangements and compositions published by Tapspace Publications, Row-Loff Productions, Hober Reber Productions, and Counter-Motion Marching Designs. Luke is a member of the Vic Firth Education Team and the D'Addario (Evans Drumheads) Education Collective. Luke is also the Technical Support Administrator for the Virtual Drumline:2.5 Sound Library, a product of Tapspace Publications.

Donald Kalugyer - Director of Bands, Greenwood Middle School



Donald Kalugyer has devoted much of his life to music. Prior to becoming a teacher, his primary emphasis from middle school through college was on music performance. He began his musical career as a percussionist in fifth grade, and in eighth grade participated in his first state-sponsored solo and ensemble contest. By the time he graduated from high school, Mr. Kalugyer had participated in more than 35 events, fourteen of those at the state level.

While in high school, Mr. Kalugyer was selected as a featured soloist in the Richmond (Indiana) Symphony Orchestra's young artist competition in both his junior and senior years. He performed with the orchestra as a xylophone soloist, and he and a fellow percussionist performed a duet with the Richmond, Marion, Anderson and Kokomo symphony orchestras.

In college Mr. Kalugyer continued his performance emphasis and during his junior year was selected as a marimba soloist with the Ball State Wind Ensemble. During his senior year, he won the undergraduate concerto competition and was featured as a soloist with the Ball State Symphony Orchestra. He also performed with the Muncie, Anderson and Kokomo symphonies.

Mr. Kalugyer performed for two summers as a member of the Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps, playing timpani and marimba. It is during this time that he feels he learned the most about the marching activity. He assisted several different high school marching band programs before graduating from Ball State University.

Upon graduation, Mr. Kalugyer was offered the position of assistant director of bands at Bedford North Lawrence High School. During his tenure there, the school competed for the first time in the state marching finals in Class A and received gold ratings with both his concert and jazz bands. In 1989, he became director of bands at Indian Creek High School. During his four years as director, the program grew in both number of students participating and quality. The marching band advanced from a 21st place finish in state fair competition in his first year to a fourth place finish in his final year. The concert band also earned its first ever division one rating in the Indiana State School Music Association (ISSMA) Concert Band Festival in Group II.

In 1993, Mr. Kalugyer was named assistant director of bands at Greenwood High School. While at Greenwood, he has contributed to seven state championships in ISSMA Class B marching band competition. Under his direction, the jazz program grew and became an ambassador to the Greenwood community, performing for many community events. The concert band consistently received Division I ratings in Groups II and III.

At the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year, Mr. Kalugyer requested a transfer to become director of bands at Greenwood Middle School. He is enthusiastic about the opportunity to introduce beginning and intermediate level students to the joys of instrumental music. He also continues to work with the Greenwood High School Marching Band and indoor winter percussion.

Mr. Kalugyer earned a master's degree from the University of Indianapolis and is a member of Phi Beta Mu professional music fraternity. He is also a member of the Indiana Bandmasters Association and ISSMA.

A native of Richmond, Indiana, Mr. Kalugyer is the son of John Kalugyer, Jr. and Ruth Kalugyer and is the youngest of four children. He has two children. Pam was founder and first president of the Indiana High School Color Guard Association 1983-1985. She served as Contest Director/Coordinator of the IHSCGA Prelims and State Finals from 1989-1999. In 2002, Pam was presented with the Envoy Award, as she was one of three color guard directors elected as the first inductees to the Indiana High School Color Guard Association's 'Hall of Fame.'

In 1985, Pam married Gary Wishmeyer, a former band director at Ben Davis High School, who served as an Indiana University Supervisor of Student Teachers and a consultant for Music Travel prior to his death in February of 2017. They are the proud parents of children, Shayla and Dustin. Shayla is an instructional coach at Sugar Grove Elementary. Dustin is a technology consulting manager with the Chicago firm Accenture.

Pam is currently the Co-Director of mathematics at Greenwood and was named Greenwood Community Schools' 2015 teacher of the year. She dedicates many hours tutoring, instructing and preparing her students for their future endeavors in mathematics.

Greenwood's Rainbow Tradition

Greenwood's 2022 show contains two selections from "The Wizard of Oz." Greenwood's association with Oz and "Over the Rainbow" dates back *nearly 50 years!*

It all started in 1973.

New band director Herman Knoll came to Greenwood from Martinsville High School and he already had his first marching show planned. Knoll was, and is, a Drum Corps fan. One of his favorites, the Cavaliers, had used "Over the Rainbow" as their corps song for many years. The Madison Scouts had also recently performed a show composed of Oz tunes. So, fully inspired, Knoll planned an Oz themed program for Greenwood's 1973 track show at the Indiana State Fair Band Day competition.

The two-part State Fair competition consisted of a preliminary round in the morning and a finals round that evening. The top 16 groups, the "Sweet 16", made up the finals competition. In 1973, Knoll's "Oz" show put Greenwood in the top 10 for the first time. "Over the Rainbow" became a signature tune for Greenwood and propelled them to 6th place in 1974 and 5th place in 1975. Also in 1975, Greenwood won 1st place at the prestigious Blue and Gold competition at Morehead State University in Kentucky. The excitement and momentum was building with each new accomplishment.

Suddenly, Herman Knoll announced that he was leaving. He had accepted a director position at his alma mater, Indiana State University. The announcement came in July with Knoll promising to stay with the Greenwood band through their 1976 State Fair show in August, but that would be his last Greenwood competition. Any sadness the students felt over the departure of Mr. Knoll was quickly turned into a desire to give him a win. Their program included "Over the Rainbow" in the mix and it easily won them a spot in the "Sweet 16."

The students really pushed themselves in the evening finals and they won the day as Greenwood was named State Fair Grand Champion! Director Knoll had ignited the Greenwood music program by showing what could be achieved through diligence, determination and hard work. And, a tradition was born.

Four years later, assistant director Mike Sweeney decided to compose a warm-up tune for the band. His decision to build the tune around "Over the Rainbow" was a welcome tribute to Herman Knoll and the band's accomplishments. Now, the warm-up itself has become a tradition. But, it's a tradition that must be earned every season. The band only plays the "Woodmen Warm-up" when the director feels the show and players are ready for ISSMA competition. That level of readiness varies from year to year.

And the tradition continues. To celebrate the 30th Anniversary of the 1976 win, the Marching Woodmen presented "The Rainbow Revisited" as their 2006 ISSMA show. It too carried them to victory. So, when Greenwood fans post rainbow photos on Facebook, smile at any mention of "The Wizard of Oz" or tear up during the "Woodmen Warm-up", ...**TRADITION!**
